Some things that were accomplished during the summer:

- Park repair from damage storms caused, fence and picnic table repaired, and new sand put in at all beaches.
- Two new blacktop approaches put in at Junior and Higgins.
- Continued work on the roads to keep them in good condition.
- Extensive attention to the lake itself, weed treatments and follow-ups to make sure we are on top of the condition of the lake.

Parks:

We would like to remind everyone that the parks are for all RLPOA residents to use. Those of you who take your dogs to the park should have them on leashes (this is a Hamburg Township Law). Also, you must clean up after your dog when they are in the parks, including when dogs use the sand by the beaches as their "potty" spot.

We want to thank Debbie Zinkel for taking on the care of our beaches by removing the seaweed and goose poop and raking the sand on a regular basis.

Roads:

Road maintenance is done throughout the year. We ask that you not park on the roads, as having vehicles in the way causes issues with grading, snow removal and/or chloride

treatments being done by our contractors. If a vehicle is parked in the road there is a likelihood that the contractors will not be able to do the job we have hired them to do and we all want our roads maintained and kept in good condition.

Boating:

Even though the lake activity will come to a close soon, we want to remind everyone that boating requires a lot of safety. When on the lake, watercraft must move in a counterclockwise direction. When any watercraft is pulling a skier, or tuber behind them a spotter is required, this is a State of Michigan law.

Lake:

Whether large or small bodies of water, the state is continuing to stress the importance of minimizing the spread of aquatic invasive species and cleaning equipment.

Aquatic invasive species continue to be spread by boaters and anglers, primarily by those who travel between waterways without cleaning their equipment. They can be spread by anchors, boats, fishing gear, waders, and other watercrafts.
