#### DO YOU SUFFER FROM BLIGHT?

Does your neighbor's yard look like a junkyard?

When you look over your side fence do you see an old junk car?...or an old boat that hasn't been used for years?

Don't give up hope. There is something you can do about it, but it takes some action by you to get rid of this neighborhood blight. Success will be more likely if you band together with other neighbors to rid your community of this nuisance.

Your Board is keenly aware of the many blight problems in our area. They constantly hear complaints from members about these kinds of problems. They have contacted Hamburg Township about this issue, and provide you here with some useful tips.

Hamburg Township has blight ordinances which cover the subject of junk in general in yards. Specifically, unlicensed vehicles and boats must be stored \_\_\_\_\_ indoors. Many

indoors. Many kinds of objects can be part of a blight nuisance:

items like old washing machines, abandoned bicycles, old piles of wood, old ladders and furniture, inoperable machinery, and, of course, unlicensed cars or boats.

Obviously it would be wonderful if every resident kept their yard clean and tidy, but the reality is some people simply don't care about how their yard looks, and so blight problems develop.

Residents can file a blight complaint form with Hamburg Township online and can remain anonymous. They will begin an investigation of the matter which can lead to a formal citation given to the offending party. Hamburg Township Supervisor Pat Hohl states that over 110 citations have been issued in the Township in just the last year for blight problems.

Obviously it would be useful if you could provide the Township with photographs documenting the blight. Also, it is particularly helpful if multiple neighbors actually file a formal complaint, then let the Township do their job of enforcing these ordinances

Please don't throw yard waste in the lake. When yard waste ends up in the lake, it adds more nutrients to the water, which in turn helps the weeds to grow.

Decomposing yard waste in the lake also depletes the oxygen needed for fish to live.



#### PARK PARKING PROBLEMS



The parking spaces at each of our parks are for the use of members actually using the parks at that time. Although this rule seems obvious, there have been continuing problems with cars parked at our parks improperly, sometimes for extended periods of time. There have been numerous instances where members wanting to use the parks have been unable to find parking spaces because non-users have taken needed spaces.

There are already signs posted prohibiting overnight parking, but, in spite of this, people continue to park their cars at the parks for long periods of time, clearly violating the rules.

The Board is considering creating more restrictive rules to combat this problem.

It is very inconsiderate to park your vehicle at the parks when you are not currently using the park facilities. It is important to show common courtesy and follow these simple rules.

Did you know you are supposed to be using potassium chloride instead of sodium chloride in your water softener? Hamburg Township passed an ordinance some years ago forbidding the use of sodium chloride in water softeners for those hooked up to the sewer system.

We have received numerous complaints about boats being parked close to lakefront properties which is intrusive to the shoreline residents.

While boating regulations can control a lot of activities on the water, there are some things that these regulations don't cover: simply showing consideration for others. Sometimes the leisure of members on the shore is disrupted by boaters that choose to park their boats close to, and directly in front of, their shoreline residences.

When parking your boat on the lake, please consider the impact that may have on the feelings of the shoreline residents.

#### Spring has Sprung ... And The Dogs Are Running Loose!



Does your dog run loose?
According to the State of
Michigan "leash law", no dog
is legally allowed to run
loose. Calls have been
received concerning certain
dogs that are allowed to run
loose in the neighborhood. Is
your dog one of these?

Very few people are pleased with someone else's dog running free. Dogs that are not leashed are a very serious concern, especially for residents who enjoy their walk. A loose dog is against the law, and no one should have to deal with your stray dog.

Animal Control asks anyone to contact them immediately if you see a dog running loose. If you know who owns the dog, Animal Control will speak with the owner and help them to understand that this situation will not be tolerated. If the dog is a stray, Animal Control will come to get the dog. They will definitely try to help you with any given situation. You can contact them at 517-546-2154.

# this season, let's all remember the 100 foot rule!

According to the boating laws, one is not to operate their boat or personal watercraft at greater than slow-no wake speed if the vessel or persons being towed are within 100 feet of a shoreline, any moored or anchored boat, any marked swimming area or person(s) in the water, a dock or raft. Slow-no wake speed is the slowest speed at which it is still possible to maintain steering and does not create a wake. In addition, if a personal watercraft is operating at greater than slowno wake speed, it must not cross within 150 feet behind another boat other than a personal watercraft.

Boats and personal watercraft are also supposed to operate in a counter-clockwise direction except in areas marked by well -defined channels.

These two laws are probably a couple of the most disregarded parts of the boating laws. Let's be sure and keep all of the boating laws in mind during the upcoming boating season. By observing all of the boating laws, we can all work to keep Rush Lake accident free!
